- O → Of (Acts as multiplication)
- D → Division $\div$
- M → Multiplication $\times$
- A → Addition $+$
- S → Subtraction $-$

2. Solved Step-by-Step Expression Examples

Present these one beautifully solved math expressions on your chart inside decorative "clouds" or boxes.

✨ Example 1: Standard Multi-Operation Expression

Solve: $45 - [38 - \{60 \div 3 - (6 - 9 \div 3)\}]$

Step 1 (Inner Parenthesis - Division first):

$$9 \div 3 = 3 \rightarrow (6 - 3)$$

Step 2 (Finish Parenthesis): $6 - 3 = 3$

Step 3 (Curly Brackets - Division first):

$$60 \div 3 = 20 \rightarrow \{20 - 3\}$$

Step 4 (Finish Curly Brackets): $20 - 3 = 17$

Step 5 (Square Brackets): $[38 - 17] = 21$

Step 6 (Final Operation): $45 - 21 = 24$

Solve: $18 + (24 \div 6 \text{ of } 2) - 5$

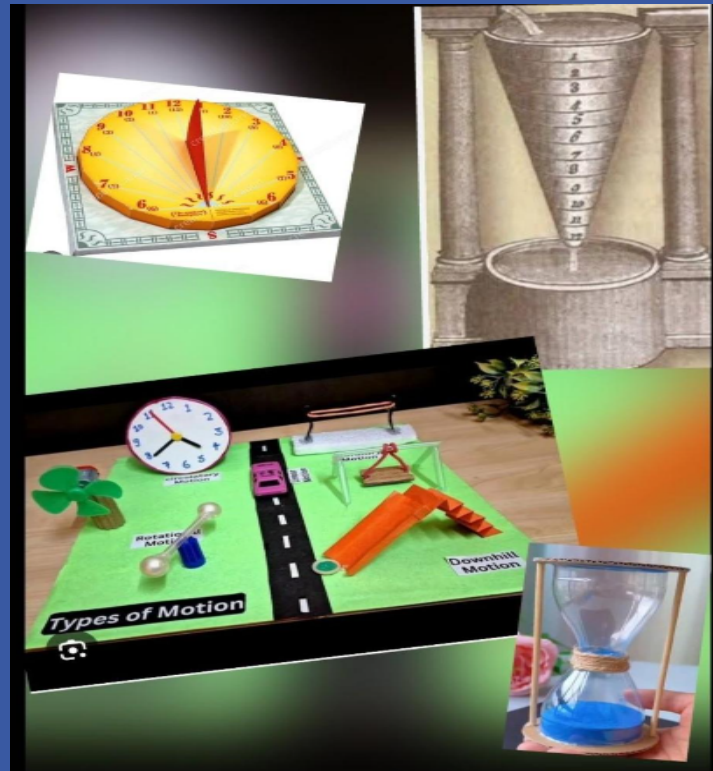
💡 Creative Finishing Touches

Show: Conduction (metal rod/spoon), Convection (water heating process), Radiation (sun heat reaching Earth)

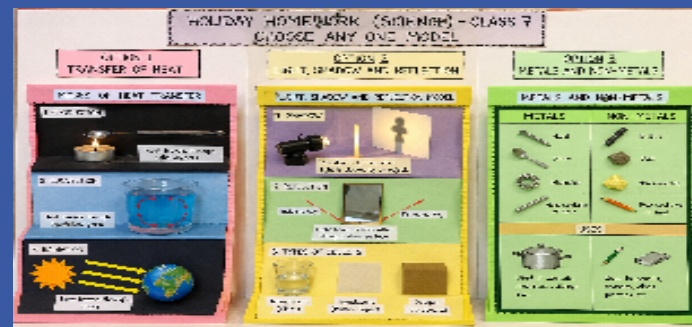
💡 (Roll no. 21 to 25): Light, Shadow and Reflection

Roll no. 16 to 32

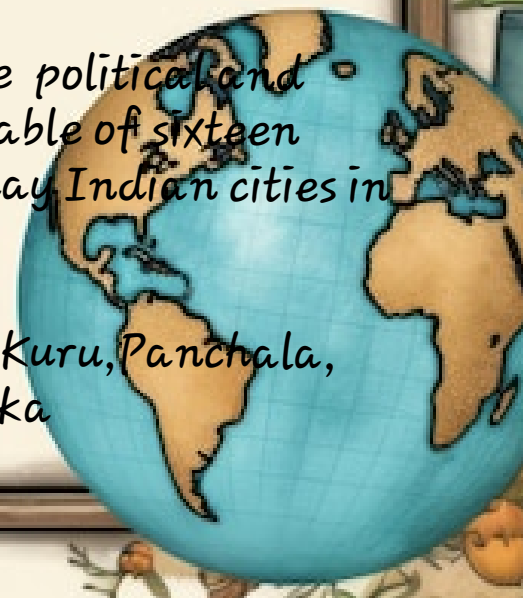
* Prepare a 3D model of physical features of India with clay. Mark all landscapes.
